SENATE AMENDMENTS TO S.B. 1285
(Reference to printed bill)

1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert:

2 "Section 1. Section 13-3401, Arizona Revised Statutes, is amended
3 to read:

4 13-3401. Definitions

5 In this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires:

6 1. "Administer" means to apply, inject or facilitate the inhalation
7 or ingestion of a substance to the body of a person.

8 2. "Amidone" means any substance identified chemically as
9 (4-4-diphenyl-6-dimethylamine-heptanone-3), or any salt of such substance,
10 by whatever trade name designated.

11 3. "Board" means the Arizona state board of pharmacy.

12 4. "Cannabis" means the following substances under whatever names
13 they may be designated:

14 (a) The resin extracted from any part of a plant of the genus
15 cannabis, and every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or
16 preparation of such plant, its seeds or its resin. Cannabis does not
17 include oil or cake made from the seeds of such plant, any fiber,
18 compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of the
19 mature stalks of such plant except the resin extracted from the stalks or
20 any fiber, oil or cake or the sterilized seed of such plant which is
21 incapable of germination.

22 (b) Every compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or
23 preparation of such resin or tetrahydrocannabinol.

24 5. "Coca leaves" means cocaine, its optical isomers and any
25 compound, manufacture, salt, derivative, mixture or preparation of coca
26 leaves, except derivatives of coca leaves which do not contain cocaine,
27 ecgonine or substances from which cocaine or ecgonine may be synthesized
28 or made.

29 6. "Dangerous drug" means the following by whatever official,
30 common, usual, chemical or trade name designated:

31 (a) Any material, compound, mixture or preparation that contains
32 any quantity of the following hallucinogenic substances and their salts,
33 isomers, whether optical, positional or geometric, and salts of isomers,
34 unless specifically excepted, whenever the existence of such salts,
35 isomers and salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical
36 designation:

37 (i) Alpha-ethyltryptamine.

38 (ii) Alpha-methyltryptamine.

39 (iii) (2-aminopropyl) benzofuran (APB).

19 salts of isomers is possible within the specific chemical designation. For
20 the purposes of this subdivision, "cannabimimetic substances" means any
21 substances within the following structural classes:
22 (i) 2-(3-hydroxycyclohexyl)phenol with substitution at the
23 5-position of the phenolic ring by alkyl or alkenyl, whether or not
24 substituted on the cyclohexyl ring to any extent. Substances in the
25 2-(3-hydroxycyclohexyl)phenol generic definition include CP-47,497,
26 CP-47,497 C8-Homolog, CP-55,940 and CP-56,667.
27 (ii) 3-(naphthoyl)indole or 3-(naphthylmethane)indole by
28 substitution at the nitrogen atom of the indole ring, whether or not
29 further substituted on the indole ring to any extent, whether or not
30 substituted on the naphthoyl or naphthyl ring to any extent. Substances in
31 the 3-(naphthoyl)indole generic definition include AM-678, AM-2201,

45 in the 3-naphthoyl-indazole or 3-(naphthylmethane)-indazole generic
46 definition include THJ2201 and THJ-018.
47 (iv) 3-(naphthoyl)pyrrole by substitution at the nitrogen atom of
48 the pyrrole ring, whether or not further substituted in the pyrrole ring
49 to any extent, whether or not substituted on the naphthoyl ring to any

1 extent. Substances in the 3-(naphthoyl)pyrrole generic definition include
2 JWH-030, JWH-145, JWH-146, JWH-147, JWH-150, JWH-156, JWH-243, JWH-244,
3 JWH-245, JWH-246, JWH-292, JWH-293, JWH-307, JWH-308, JWH-346, JWH-348,

10 include JWH-176.

11 (vi) 3-(phenylacetyl)indole or 3-(benzoyl)indole by substitution at
12 the nitrogen atom of the indole ring, whether or not further substituted
13 in the indole ring to any extent, whether or not substituted on the phenyl
14 ring to any extent. Substances in the 3-(phenylacetyl)indole generic
15 definition include AM-694, AM-2233, JWH-167, JWH-201, JWH-202, JWH-203,
16 JWH-204, JWH-205, JWH-206, JWH-207, JWH-208, JWH-209, JWH-237, JWH-248,

24 cyclobutyl or cyclopentyl rings to any extent. Substances in the
25 3-(cyclopropylmethanone) indole generic definition include UR-144,
26 fluoro-UR-144 and XLR-11.

27 (viii) 3-adamantoylindole with substitution at the nitrogen atom of
28 the indole ring, whether or not further substituted on the indole ring to
29 any extent, whether or not substituted on the adamantyl ring to any
30 extent. Substances in the 3-adamantoylindole generic definition include
31 AB-001.

32 (ix) N-(adamantyl)-indole-3-carboxamide with substitution at the
33 nitrogen atom of the indole ring, whether or not further substituted on
34 the indole ring to any extent, whether or not substituted on the adamantyl
35 ring to any extent. Substances in the N-(adamantyl)-indole-3-carboxamide
36 generic definition include SDB-001.

37 (x) Indole-3-carboxamide or indazole-3-carboxamide with
38 substitution at the nitrogen atom of the indole ring or by substitution at
39 one or both of the nitrogen atoms of the indazole ring, whether or not
40 further substituted on the indole ring or the indazole ring to any extent,
41 whether or not substituted on the nitrogen of the carboxamide to any
42 extent. Substances in the indole-3-carboxamide or indazole-3-carboxamide
43 generic definition include AKB-48, fluoro-AKB-48, APINACA, AB-PINACA,
44 AB-FUBINACA, ABICA and ADBICA.

45 (xi) 8-Quinolinylnyl-indole-3-carboxylate or 8-quinolinylnyl-indazole-3-
46 carboxylate by substitution at the nitrogen atom of the indole ring or by
47 substitution at one or both of the nitrogen atoms of the indazole ring,
48 whether or not further substituted in the indole ring or indazole ring to
49 any extent, whether or not substituted on the quinoline ring to any

1 extent. Substances in the 8-quinolinyl-indole-3-carboxylate or the
2 8-quinolinyl-indazole-3-carboxylate generic definition include PB-22,
3 fluoro-PB-22, NPB-22 and fluoro-NPB-22.

4 (xii) Naphthalenyl-indole-3-carboxylate or naphthalenyl-indazole-3-
5 carboxylate by substitution at the nitrogen atom of the indole ring or by
